Pope lands in Brazil to find faith on the mend

THE POPE arrives in Brazil today for a five-day visit to the world's biggest Catholic country and, after decades of grim news about the exodus of his flock to Protestantism, he will find some rare and welcoming encouragement.

A new study shows that for the first time since records began in 1872, the Roman Catholic Church in Brazil has stemmed the rapid decline of worshippers to other religions. The study, based on government census data, shows that 73.79 per cent of Brazilians declared themselves Catholic in 2003, almost exactly the same number (73.89 per cent) as three years earlier.

The proportion of Protestants continued to rise - to 17.9 per cent from 16.2 per cent - but those joining one of the dozens of Protestant denominations were no longer disaffected Catholics but unhappy followers of other religions or people who had previously declared themselves to have no religious faith.

That levelling out is great news for the new Pontiff, who does not enjoy the same popularity in the region as his predecessor John Paul II and who is known for his opposition to liberation theology, the left-leaning doctrine that took hold in Latin America in the 1980s with calls for social justice.

"The surprise is the stabilisation of the number of Catholics," said the study's author Marcelo Neri, an economist at the Getulio Vargas Foundation, a Rio business school. "Catholics haven't attracted more faithful but they are no longer losing their flock."

Mr Neri said the death of Pope John Paul II and the huge media coverage that surrounded his burial and succession may have helped boost Catholicism in Brazil. Estranged Catholics watching the blanket coverage realised they felt more strongly than they thought and returned to the Church.



But in Brazil, a huge nation with an estimated 139 million Catholics, the main factors for the Vatican's recovery were economic and social, Mr Neri said.

Protestant religions spring up quickest in impoverished urban areas where the state is absent. Friendly pastors and an open doors policy at churches give the poor a crutch to lean on in hard times. Now, with Brazil's economy doing well and salaries rising, especially among the less well off, the poor are no longer so dependent on Protestant churches for assistance.

Another reason is that the Catholic Church has learned it must go after followers using the same modern methods as its spiritual rivals. Protestant churches have lured believers by offering services and assistance that are happier, friendlier and more down-to-earth. The Catholic Church has looked distant and out of touch.

In recent years the Vatican has loosened the shackles on Brazilian priests and given its blessing to singers, actors and writers to go after the young and trendy. The Church has accepted, if not wholly embraced, priests who evangelise in song, on surfboards and skateboards, through self-help books and TV shows and on the internet.

The best example of the trend is Father Marcelo Rossi, a charismatic and media-savvy priest who has sold millions of CDs featuring songs like Clapping for Jesus, Raise Your Hands and the Jesus Twist.

Father Rossi has a daily radio show, two weekly TV shows, a busy internet portal and hosts regular concert-cum-shows at which thousands of young fans dance to his catchy gospel pop.

He once attracted 2.4 million fans to one of his appearances in São Paulo and his draw is such that he was invited to give a live performance immediately after Benedict XVI says mass in São Paulo on 11 May.

"Father Marcelo is one of those people most responsible for halting the loss of followers," said Antonio Miguel Kater Filho, Director of the Brazilian Institute of Catholic Marketing. "He communicates something that might be difficult to communicate in other ways and he attracts people to him. He has charisma."

In the past, the Vatican frowned upon such prophets and anything resembling a commercial show of faith but their success in fighting the Protestant encroachment has prompted it to adopt a more convenient silence on the issue, both in Brazil and elsewhere in Latin America.

No-one knows whether the plateau means the Vatican's prayers have been answered or whether the numbers will continue to fall again later. But one thing is certain: the Pope will welcome signs of a renaissance with open arms.

Father Rossi might not be able to get Benedict dancing at the altar, but the numbers just might.

HARMLESS PLACEBO OR MIRACLE CURE?

EACH day in São Paulo, thousands of the faithful line up outside an 18th-century monastery to receive tiny rice-paper pills they believe can cure everything from infertility and diabetes to cancer and Alzheimer's disease.

The miracles are attributed to Antonio de Sant'Anna Galvão, a Franciscan monk who began making and handing out the Tic Tac-sized pellets in the 18th century after reportedly curing a boy's kidney stones. On 11 May, Pope Benedict will canonise Galvão as the first native-born saint from the world's largest Roman Catholic country. Today, 13 nuns work in the monastery where Galvão is buried to prepare the more than

5,000 pills distributed free each day. Each pill is inscribed with a prayer in Latin: "After birth, the Virgin remained intact. Mother of God, intercede on our behalf."

Doctors and even some clergy say the pills are merely reassuring placebos and breed superstition. But Sandra Grossi de Almeida, 37, credits them for the birth of her son, Enzo, despite a uterine malformation that should have made it impossible for her to carry him for more than four months. Sitting next to Enzo, now seven, she said: "I believe in God; the proof is here."
