Brazil's main presidential candidates will likely continue the policies of out-going President, Luiz Ignacio Lula da Silva, that nurtured an economic boom in the South American country.

Brazil has risen to be a regional economic power and turned into one of the world's hottest emerging markets. With the country, preparing to elect Lula's successor next Sunday, the economy's future guidelines, are high on the agenda. Both leading candidates are from mainstream parties, and broadly endorse the pillars of current policies, that made Brazil one of the world's fastest-growing emerging economies. One

economist, says Brazil can count on its domestic market, to sustain high growth rates.

Economist Marcelo Neri said, "I think our next president has to be open a market for the poor, give a leading role to the poor, to this new middle class, through quality education, through more functional labor and pension laws and through micro-credit. I think Brazilians should be treated as the main characters of their history -- that's what Brazilians want."
